

The 501st Heavy Panzer Unit was deployed in January 1943 to Tunisia. Most tanks were painted overall DAK Sand, but some were over painted with green shade. Per photographic documentation, the road wheels were left in DAK Sand on 142. This is the 1/76th scale Nitto kit, circa the 1970's. The kit is an early on offering with instructions in Japanese. A number of corrections were made. Example, the headlights and mud guards were modified in the field. An antenna was added. The turret machine gun port was drilled out as were the tow rings. George Bradford's "AFV Camouflage & Markings, North Africa, 1940 - 1943" as well as reviews from HyperScale were helpful. The tank commander is from the Airfix collection of WWII figures.

- All judging is final !

# Contest Categories

- 1. SHOW ROOM STOCK: Any vehicle produced by a major manufacturer as presented on the show room floor.
- 2. BOX STOCK: Built using parts supplied in the kit. Other decals and Baremetal foil is allowed.
- 3. STREET ROD: 1948 and older modified vehicle.
- 4. STREET MACHINE: 1949 and newer modified vehicles.
- 5. CURB SIDE: Models are judged as displayed on table, judges do not pick up the models.
- 6. CUSTOM: Major or minor body modifications.
- 7. PRO STREET: Must be street legal.
- 8. COMMERCIAL & PUBLIC SERVICE: Light & heavy trucks, vans, fire, military, rescue, police and taxi.
- 9. NON-COMMERCIAL: Pick-ups, vans, 4x4's. Must be street legal.
- 10. SMALL SCALE: Vehicles 1/32 scale and smaller.
- 11. LARGE SCALE: Vehicles larger than 1/24 scale.
- **12. MOTORCYCLES: All Scales and Styles**
- 13. JUNIORS: Ages 12 and under.
- 14. JUNIORS: Ages 13 17.
- 15. UNFINISHED: Only one major component is allowed to be completed. Does not have to be in primer
- 16. SLAMMERS: No engines or interiors. Judges do not pick up the models.
- 17. COMPETITION STRAIGHT LINE: All race cars that run in a straight line, Drag racing, Bonneville.
- 18. COMPETITION OUT OF BOX: All years and divisions. Aftermarket decals and Baremetal foil is allowed.
- 19. COMPETITION NASCAR : 1990 and newer.
- 20. COMPETITION NASCAR HISTORICAL: 1989 and earlier. All divisions.
- 21. IMPORTS AND TUNERS: Stock or modified.
- 22. ALL OTHER COMPETITION: Must be automotive related.
- 23. MISCELLANEOUS: Any automotive related model that does not fit into one of the other categories.
- 24. DIORAMAS: Any type of scene involving an automotive subject.
- 25. THEME: TOM DANIEL DESIGN Any Model Vehicle Designed by Tom Daniel.
- A. Out of Box Any Tom Daniel Designed kit built out of the box. No aftermarket detail allowed.
- B. Modified Any Tom Daniel Designed model with aftermarket detail parts and scratch building. Also models built from any of Tom's "Sketch Pad" renderings featured in past automotive and modeling magazines.

- Bring your entries to the Car Show on Saturday, March 5th From 9:00AM - 1:00PM. Your paid admission into the car show allows you to enter as many models as you want at no additional charge.
- Judging Will Be Held Between 1:00PM 3:00PM
- Entry Forms Will Be Available On-line and at the Registration Table
- Awards Presented At 4:00PM on Saturday, March 5<sup>th</sup>
