This is the circa 1960's Airfix kit purchased for 50 cents.

The rivet detail was sanded away and a ladies stocking mesh was used for the filter. Pencil leads represent the 23-mm. wing cannons. E.S.C.I. decals were used with Pactra paints.

The Shturmovik was a large, rugged ground attack aircraft with tremendous destructive capacity. The II-2M3 was simple and cheap to produce, even by Western standards.

The Germans called the Shturmovik "Black Death", (Schwartz Tod)



### RVIPMS demo at the Rail Yard Hobby Shop 3-18-2008



B/S

Box Stock

- 1. Cars are to be 1/24 or 1/25 scale plastic models of passenger vehicles.
- 2. Cars must use wheels, tires and axles supplied in the kit.
- 3. You may use any kit parts supplied in the box.
- 4. Models must have full interiors.

Pro Mod Pro Modified

- 1. Cars are to be 1/24 or 1/25 scale models.
- 2. Maximum weight of model cannot be more than 8 ounces.
- 3. Any type of wheel, tire and axle may be used.
- 4. Models must have 4 wheels that touch the track and be able to roll.

The April Business Meeting is Thursday the 24th at 7:00 pm, 5th Floor at the Center in the Square.

All Club Contest in 2008 will be "Open", meaning any kit subject as long as it has not been entered before.
