
# FROM THE CROW'S NEST BY TIM WARD



## S.C.A.M.P.S.



An Article by the Star City Armor Modeling & Preservation Society







This 75 mm self propelled howitzer along with the Autoblinda armored car were two of the more successful Italian A.F.V.'s used in North Africa.

It was powered by a V-8 diesel engine. The crew of three consisted of an officer or NCO, and two enlisted tankists. The tankist uniform was unique. It consisted of a 3/4 length black leather coat and helmet. Under the coat a dark blue coverall was worn. The officer wears a custom made black leather jacket and officer's gray trousers.

This 1/35 scale Italeri kit was built out of the box with a few details like using the Ed Kennedy technique of a teabag to form the canvas tarp stored on the left front fender.


