



Kawasaki Ki-45 - "Nick" 5th Heavy Fighter Sentai Komaki Air Base, Japan, 1944 by Terry Eastman



The Ki-45 in this version was armed with a forward firing armament of a 20 mm. cannon, and two 12.5 machine guns.

The "Nick" was used in defense of the home islands to deter U.S. Air Force bombers. It had a top speed of 339 m.p.h at 22,965 feet. The climb to 16,405 feet took 6 minutes with a service ceiling of 32,810 feet.

The color scheme of this Hasegawa 1/72nd scale kit is a wrap around application of IJA Green, FS 34092. The white home defense bands predominate.


