Up Close Visit With Space Shuttle Atlantis:


This past September my family and I spent a week in Florida on vacation and one of the main stops on the “to do” list was visit The Kennedy Space Center. While we had visited the Space Center on previous trips we were really looking forward to this visit due to the Space Shuttle Atlantis being on display for viewing since its retirement after its last flight on July 21, 2011. Not only was this Atlantis’s last flight but the last flight for all Shuttles in the program. The other three Shuttle’s had been retired after their last flights and were on display in various other museums across the United States.

Upon entering the building that Atlantis is housed in you think that you would just be walking into a huge room and there it would be, but no that’s not how Kennedy Space Center did it at all. When you enter the building you begin a three story climb on a slow rising ramp that has a multitude of Atlantis pictures, murals, flight history, past crew member’s pictures and numerous other facts that have to do with Atlantis. After you work your way to the top floor you are treated to a five minute video of the how the Shuttle program began (hosted by a past Shuttle pilot on our visit) than another five minute video on the history of the Shuttle Atlantis. At the end of the second video you see the Shuttle flying through space and as it makes a turn to fly towards you the video begins to fade out as the back drop rises and all of a sudden you are almost face to face with the real Shuttle Atlantis. I can only say that it will give you a weird feeling when you see this creation for the first time. No pictures or video on TV can do justice to what you see in person.

Atlantis flew its first mission in 1985 and flew a total of 33 missions before its retirement. This shuttle was almost 3.5 tons lighter than previous Shuttles due to new thermal protection covers instead of tiles on top of the Shuttle. The majority of Atlantis’s flights were to MIR with other flights being for Military and various other type missions.
