As I Ponder Weak And Weary.... By: Penny Pierce

No, this isn't one of Poe's poems, but the title seemed appropriate since it came to my mind at 2:30 am as well as the subject. Not many of us remember these funeral home beauties, except from old black and white gangster movies, or mob documentaries. Maybe one of the car guys out there can take a shot at scratch building one of these babies! OK, here it goes!



In 1936, the flower car was designed for the propose of displaying the beautiful basket of flowers as they were being transported to the cemetery for the graveside services. Some of the first flower cars were your everyday convertibles, but the first cars to be be considered flower cars were sometimes called "*Chicago*" or "*Western*".

Funeral services in Chicago usually called for the renting of the hearses and/or limousines to be used by the funeral homes. The flower cars soon were found along the east coast of the US, in larger cities like Boston and New York, but never was as popular out on the west coast.

The most recognized funerals known to have flower cars in them were the gangsters from the 1920s' thru the 1940's, such as Dion O'Bannon and Frankie Yale. The picture to the right is the funeral procession of the opera singer Dame Nellie Melba.

The flower cars usually were directly in front of the hearse during the procession, until the creation of the "dual-purpose" car, which had an adjustable deck used to carry both flowers and the casket.

By World War II, the flower cars were an important part of the funeral business, and found their peak years during the 1950's. However, by the late 1970's these beautiful Cadillacs were replaced with the basic El Caminos and/or Rancheros.

The last flower car offered as a standard production model was in 1988 when the new Eureka Coach Company in Toronto, Canada delivered about 12 front-wheel-drive Cadillacs.
