P-38F-15 Lightning "The Sad Sack" 95th FS, 2Lt. Roland O Leeman Vicenza, Italy 1944

This is the fantastic new 1/48 Tamiya model. I built her as "The Sad Sack" at the time of her 183rd mission in Italy at the end of May, 1944. More than thirty pilots flew her from December 1942.

The model is really fantastic, I just added the Eduard cockpit instrument panel, gun barrels, and supercharges, and the wheels are from a Res Kit detail set. The kit original parts are just fine, but the resin details are raising the level of the details. I have to say that probably the wheels and the gun barrels are two weak aspect of the model. The engineering of the model is unbelievable, everything fit perfectly and you need to work really hard for making mistakes. However, I thought I could be smarter of Tamiya and decided of not following the instructions and you can image the consequences.... Anyway, after cursing against my stupidity and a yoga section I was able to fix my mistakes and eventually finish the model. This is also my first attempt to depict a model with a significant amount of chipping. If you look at pictures of these airplanes this aspect was very evident. I image that after 183 mission she should have a significant deterioration of her painting. For the chipping I have used a combination of chipping fluid from MIG AMMO, a silver pencil and some sponge technique. I am very pleased with the final result.

This is also the first model I was able to finish in two years. I think this is likely the only good aspect of the stay at home due the pandemic.
