# Memories of Crossroads Hobbies:

Ronnie decided to retire after some 35 years. The shop was run by his father George Black from 1963 till his retirement when Ronnie took it over full time. My early years I lived in Roanoke in the Round Hill area (near the Airport). This is back in the day when you rode your bike everywhere. Just "be home before dark" was the rule. Played many days in the cornfields which is now Valley View Mall. Cross-



roads Mall was the big attraction in its day. And the place for the youngsters was Crossroads Hobbies. Many times, I rode the bike to visit the shop and buy a model. This is after doing chores collecting the allowance and picking up bottles for the cash. At the hobby shop after walking around wide eyed and after careful selection of one model. I would approach this man with a deep voice, Mr. Black. I would plop down my Hawk, Airfix or the magical Aurora kit and pay with my pennies, nickels dimes and quarters. Sometimes a silver dollar would pass through my hands. Mr. Black always did his little calculations and round to a whole number. Usually, a dollar or two in those days. After my family moved to Salem. I would still go and visit the hobby shop. I graduated high school and as most of you know I went to sea. When home on vacation I always made a trip(s) to the hobby shop. Buying models and paints. As a student of WWII, I also purchased many board war-games that were on the shelf. I still have many of those in my collection and I swear I may have some Tamiya as well a Testers (small bottles) of paint and some unbuilt kits. In 1988 George and Ronnie moved the shop to Salem and their clientele followed. With the explosion of RC aircraft and cars the business continued. A total of 59 years Crossroads Hobbies has been a big part of a lot of kids and adult lives. Many memories were created. I visited the shop on the last day. In the name of IPMS Roanoke Valley I took a couple dozen donuts a card from all of us with a \$25 cash in the card. Ronnie was moved and asked me to forward his many thanks. I wished him well. George Black, Ronnie's father was a P-51 pilot during WWII. Unfortunately, I have no other information on his service.
