New Product Review:

This month I will be reviewing two new products I have run up on to help out in building. The first of the new products is a anti-static brush from Tamiya. This a a great brush to keep on the work bench and paint bench. With it being anti-static its great when getting ready to



paint because it helps prevent those pesky little dust spots in the paint. On the workbench it works great to dust off the finished model or prepare one for the competition table.

The second new item is a 5 second UV light glue pen. This little pen has liquid glue in it that comes out the tip like a fountain pen. When you apply it to the part it can be wiped off with no affects, even to glass, and the parts will not start to tack up until you hold the other end of the



pen with the UV light next to the glue joint. Once you do this for 5 seconds, the glue bonds the joint. I have found it's not a super strong bond, but works really well for windshields, headlights and tail lights.

Both of these items can be found on ebay or Amazon fairly reasonable in price.
